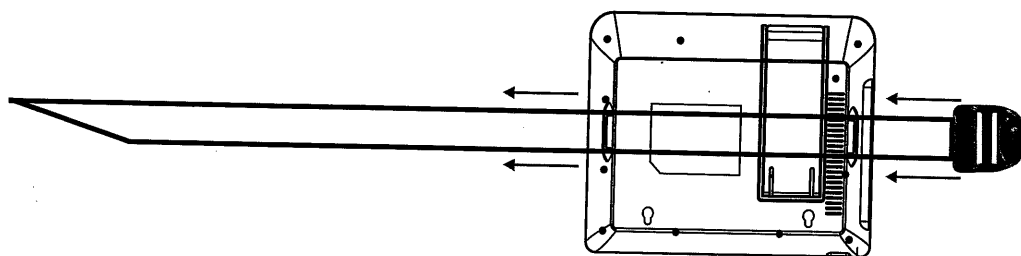


## Mounting Strap Installation

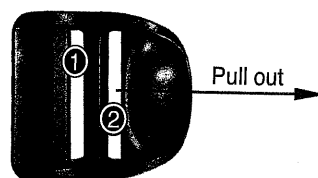
Dual Screen Portable DVD Player-SDVD1037

### Step1



Go the strap through the two holes on both sides of the rear side of the player as shown on the above figure.

### Step2

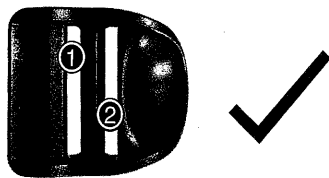


Go the strap from gap ① and go out from the rear side of the gap ② as shown on the above figure.

### Step3

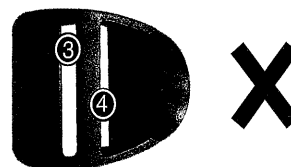
Fasten the player to the headrest of the seat in the car.

NOTE: This side must face toward you.  
The strap must be inserted into the front side of the gap ① and inserted from the rear side of the gap ② as shown on the figure above.  
The straps will be fastened securely and cannot be pulled out horizontally.

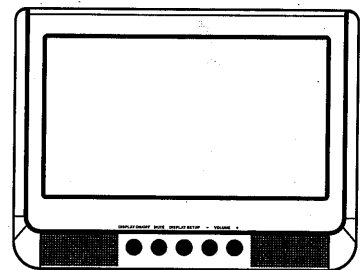
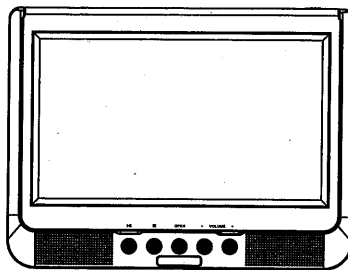


If the strap goes from the front side of the gap ③ and goes out from the rear side of the gap ④ as shown on above figure.  
The straps will not be fastened securely and can be pulled out horizontally, causing the DVD player to drop dangerously.

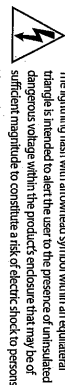

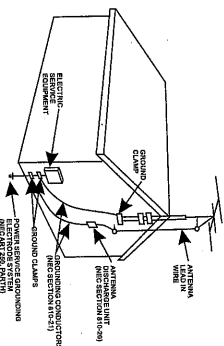

### NOTES ON HANDLING:

- When shipping the DVD player, always use the original shipping carton and packing materials. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the DVD player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD player for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.

- The top and rear panels of the DVD player may become warm after a long period of use. This is normal and not a malfunction.

- When the DVD player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.

### NOTES ON LOCATING THE DVD PLAYER:

- When you place this DVD player near a TV, radio or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, move the DVD player away from the TV, radio or VCR.

### NOTES ON CLEANING:

- Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.
- For stubborn dirt, soak a cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry. Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner and benzene, as they may damage the surface of the DVD player.
- If you use a chemical-saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

### NOTES ON MOISTURE CONDENSATION:

Moisture condensation damages the DVD player. Please read the following carefully.

- Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD player.

### Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases:

- When you bring the DVD player directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the DVD player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.

- In summer, when you use the DVD player in a hot and humid place just after you moved the unit from an air conditioned room.

- When you use the DVD player in a humid place.

### Do not use the DVD player where moisture condensation may occur.

- If you use the DVD player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the DVD player to the wall outlet, turn on the DVD player and leave it ON for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the DVD player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the DVD player connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.

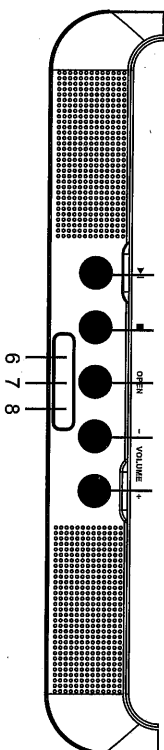

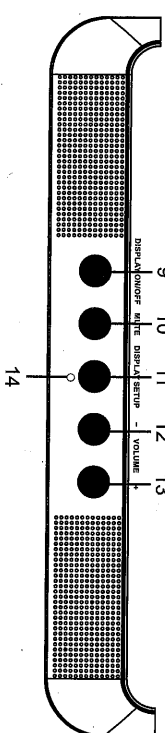
## Product Overview

### MAIN UNIT:



1. **PLAY/PAUSE (▶/⏸):** Press to switch between play and pause.
2. **STOP (■):** Press to stop playback.
3. **OPEN:** Press to open the CD door.
4. **VOL-:** Press to decrease the volume level.
5. **VOL+:** Press to increase the volume level.
6. **Charge Indicator:** Red Indicator will turn on when the unit is charging, and turn off when the unit is fully charged.
7. **Remote Control Sensor**
8. **Power Indicator:** Green indicator will turn on when the unit is powered on, and turn off if the unit is powered off.

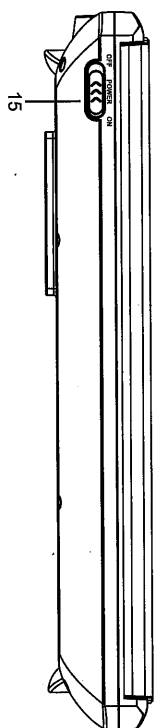

20. **DC IN:** DC in jack, connect to the DC out jack on main unit by the supplied DC connection cable.

## Remote Control



1. **DISPLAY ON/OFF:** To turn ON or OFF the screen.
2. **TITLE:** To display the title menu of current disc. Use the Direction and ENTER buttons to select and play the desired title.
3. **DISC MENU:** To display the menu of current disc. Using the Direction and ENTER buttons to select and play the desired chapter or track.
4. **Previous:** Press repeatedly to skip backward.
5. **Next:** Press repeatedly to skip forward.
6. **Stop:** Press to stop.
7. **Direction buttons:** Press to highlight the options within the setting menu.
8. **SETUP:** Press to enter or exit setup menu.
9. **Numeric buttons:** Press numeric buttons to enter numbers.
10. **PROG (Program) button:** Press to display program setting menu. Use the Numeric/Direction and ENTER buttons to set the program as on screen instructions.
11. **ZOOM:** Press repeatedly to zoom in/out the picture.
12. **DVD/USB/CARD:** When USB device and/or SD Card was inserted, press repeatedly to select the playback source as desired.
13. **GOTO:** Press to enter GOTO menu. Use the Numeric/Direction and ENTER buttons to select the desired track to play.
14. **SUBTITLE:** Press repeatedly to select the subtitle languages available in the disc.
15. **Fast Forward:** Press repeatedly to search for the desired section. Press **II** button to resume normal playback.
16. **Reverse:** Press repeatedly to search for the desired section. Press **II** button to resume normal playback.
17. **VOL+ (Volume):** Press to increase the volume level.
18. **ENTER:** Press to confirm the selection(settings).
19. **VOL- (Volume):** Press to decrease the volume level.
20. **Play/Pause:** Press to play or pause playback.
21. **AUDIO:** Press repeatedly to select the audio channels.
22. **MUTE:** Press to turn off the sound. Press again to resume the sound.

## Remote Control

23. **REPEAT:** Press repeatedly to set repeat mode.
24. **A-B:** During playback, press to set the beginning point of A-B repeat. Press again to set the end point of A-B repeat. The unit will start playback at the selected section. To resume normal playback, press the A-B button again.
25. **ANGLE:** Press repeatedly to select the available viewing angle.
26. **OSD (On Screen Display):** Press repeatedly to display the playback information.

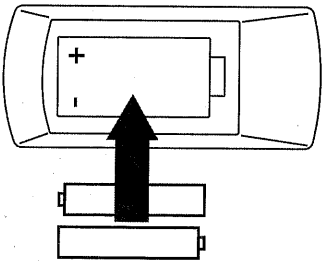
### Battery Installation:

1. Press the tabs on the battery door and lift it off.
2. Insert two (2) AAA size batteries (We recommend InfiniCell batteries for maximum performance) into the battery compartment. Make sure to match the (+) and (-) ends of the battery compartment.
3. Replace the battery compartment door.

### BATTERY PRECAUTIONS:

Follow these precautions when using a battery in this device:

- Only use the size and type of battery specified.
- Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the battery as indicated in the battery compartment.
- A reversed battery may cause damage to the device.
- Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- If the batteries in the device are consumed or the device is not used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- Do not try to recharge non-rechargeable batteries; they may overheat and rupture (Follow battery manufacturer's directions).
- Do not dispose of battery in fire. Battery may explode or leak.
- Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.



## Power Source

The unit has a built-in DC  $\approx 7.4V$  1900mAh Lithium-ion rechargeable battery. Recharge it as follows:

### Charging by supplied AC/DC adapter:

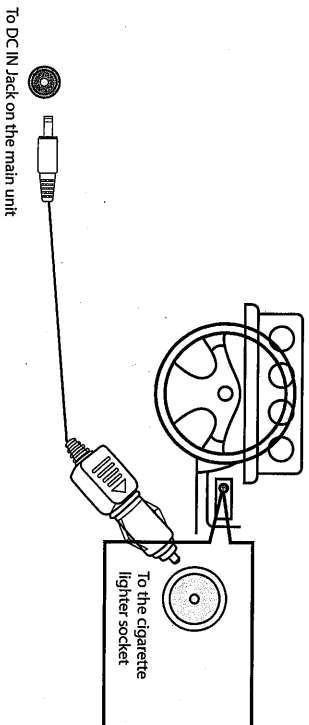
1. Connect the plug from the supplied AC/DC adapter to the DC IN Jack on the main unit.
2. Connect the AC/DC adapter to the wall outlet having AC 100-240V~, 50/60Hz.

#### Notes:

- The AC/DC adapter is intended to be correctly oriented in a vertical or floor mount position.
- Your battery will last longer if you follow these simple guidelines for caring for and storing it.
- For first time charge, charge it approximately 12 hours. For normal charge, it needs approximately 6 hours.
- Recharge and store the device within the temperature range of 5°C~35°C (40°F~95°F).
- Do not overcharge (longer than 24 hours). Excessive charging or discharging may shorten the battery's life.
- Battery life naturally shortens slowly over time.

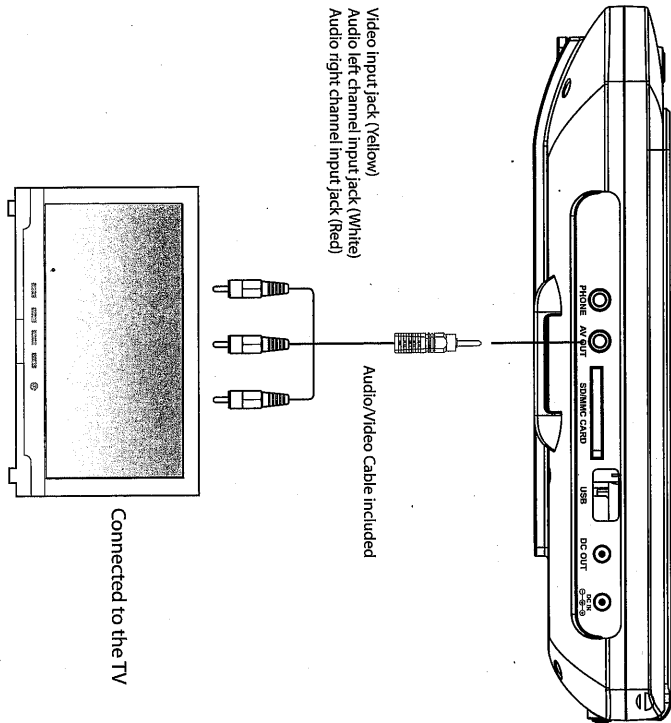
### Charging by the supplied Car Adapter:

1. Connect to the cigarette lighter socket of a vehicle that has a 12V battery as the figure below. It is NOT compatible with a vehicle that has a 24V battery.
2. This is a special negative grounded car adapter. Using this car adapter with a positive grounded car can cause a malfunction.
3. Do NOT plug in the car adapter until the car ignition is turned on.
4. Disconnect the car adapter from the cigarette lighter and the unit after use.



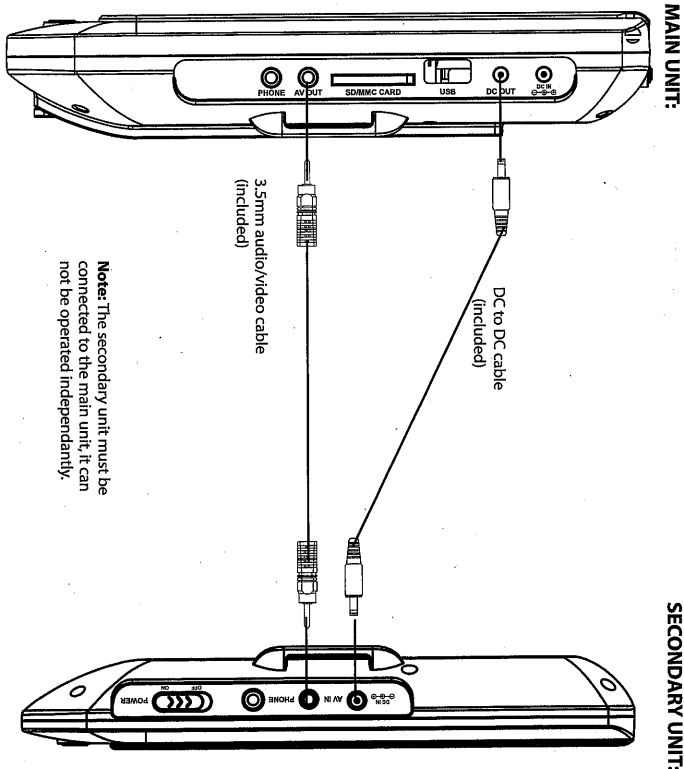
# Making Connections

## Operation

### MAIN UNIT:

1. Recharge or connect the unit to AC/DC Adaptor/ Car Adaptor as previous procedure.
2. Press the OPEN button on main unit to open the CD door.
3. Insert the disc to the center spindle with label side face up and close the lid.
4. Power on the unit by sliding the **POWER ON/OFF** switch on the rear of unit to the ON position. The green indicator will turn on and the unit will start playback automatically.
5. For private listening, insert headphones into the phone jack. The external speakers will disconnect automatically.
6. To save battery, power while listening to music, press the **DISPLAY ON/OFF** button on remote control to turn OFF. Press again to turn it back ON.
7. To power off, slide the **POWER ON/OFF** switch to the OFF position.

### SECONDARY UNIT:

1. Connect the secondary unit to the main unit by the supplied DC and AV connection cables as previous procedures.
2. Slide the **POWER ON/OFF** switch on the right side of unit to the ON position to power on the secondary unit.
3. Press the **DISPLAY SETUP** button to enter the display setting menu. Press the **MUTE** or **DISPLAY ON/OFF** to move up and down, and press **VOL +/-** button to set.  
Press the **DISPLAY SETUP** button to confirm.
4. For private listening, insert the headphones into the phone jack. The speakers will disconnect automatically.
5. To save battery power while listening to music, press the **DISPLAY ON/OFF** button to turn OFF. Press again to turn it back ON.
6. To power off, slide the **POWER ON/OFF** switch to OFF position.

## Operation

### (CD/DVD)PROGRAM:

1. During CD or DVD playback, press the **PROG** (Program) button. The Program menu appears.
2. Use the **numeric** buttons to select and set the desired TT (Title), CH (Chapters), tracks you want of the CD or DVD.

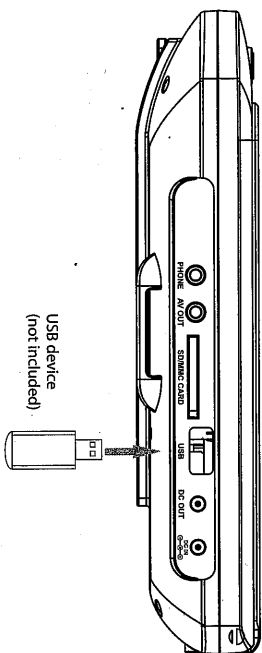

3. Use the **direction** buttons to move to the next input. Repeat step 2 until programming is completed. **Note:** Press to go to next page for programming track 11 to 20.
4. Highlight the "PLAY" icon, press the **ENTER** button to start the program play.
5. Press the **STOP** button twice to stop the program playback and clear the program memory.

## USB or SD/MMC Card Playback

1. Insert the USB Device or SD/MMC memory card into the USB port/card slot as shown on the figure below.



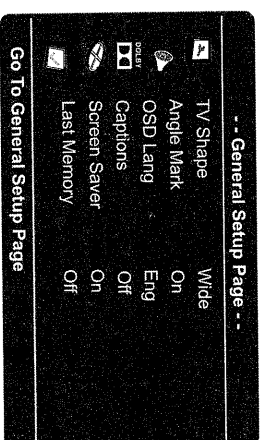
**Note:** The unit supports the following file formats:

- MP3, WMA (Music file)
  - JPEG (Pictures)
  - MPEG2, AVI, VOB (Video files up to 640 x 480 pixels)
- Make sure correct files were saved in the USB device or memory cards.
2. Power ON the unit, and wait until "No disc" appears on the screen or the disc starts to play. Press **DVD/USB/CARD** button to select the desired playback source. Wait until the folder/file list appears on the screen. Use the **direction** buttons to select the desired file, then press the **ENTER** button to start playback.

## Setting Menu

### Setting Menus:

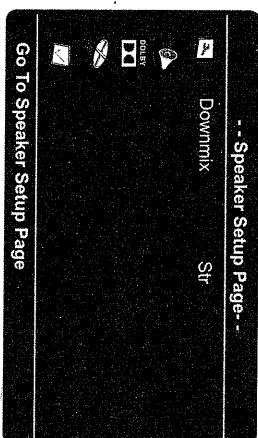
In fully stop mode, press the **SETUP** button on the remote control, the setting menu will appear on the screen as below. Use the **Direction** **◀▶▲▼**, **Numeric** and **ENTER** buttons to select and highlight the function you need to set or reset. Press the **ENTER** button to enter or confirm the selection. After setting, press the **SETUP** button to save the settings and exit.



### IN GENERAL SETUP PAGE:

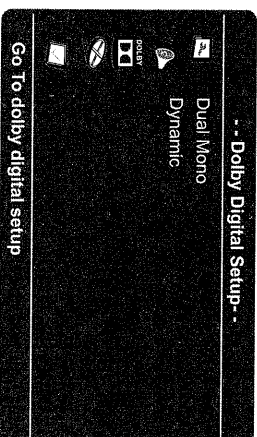
1. If the TV shape is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set the aspect ratio to match the connected TV.
2. If Angle Mark is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set it On or Off. If set to On, when multi-angles are available in the playing DVD, the multi-angle logo will appear on the screen.
3. If OSD Lang (On Screen Display Language) is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set the OSD language as desired.
4. If Captions is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set it On or Off. If set to On, when multi-language are available in playing disc, the captions will appear on screen.
5. If Screen Saver is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set it On or Off. If set to On, the screen saver will come on when the unit stops or the image is paused for approximately five minutes.
6. If Last Memory is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set it On or Off. If set to On, the unit will start playback from the position where the disc was stopped last time.

### IN SPEAKER SETUP PAGE:

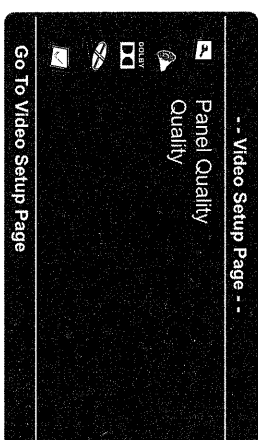
1. If Speaker Setup is selected, press the **ENTER** button, the sub-setting menu will appear.
1. If Downmix is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons set it to L/Rt, Stereo.
- If set to L/Rt, the rear left or rear right channels will play on both Left and Right Speakers.
- If set to Stereo, the rear left channel will play on left speaker; the rear right channel will play on right speaker.



### IN DOLBY DIGITAL SETUP PAGE:

1. If Dual Mono is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** button to set it to Stereo, L-Mono (Play Left channel on all speakers), R-Mono (Play Right channel on all speakers) or Mix-Mono (Mixed Right and Left channel then plays on all speakers) as desired. (Functions depend on the recording of the disc).
2. If Dynamic is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** button to set the dynamic level as desired or turn it off.

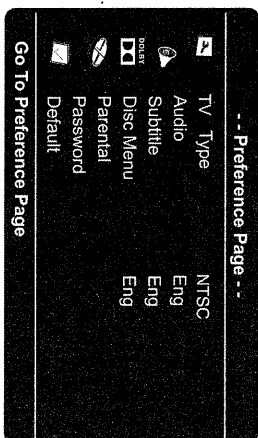

- **Brightness:** To adjust the video brightness level on a scale of -20 to +20.

2. If Audio, Subtitle or Disc Menu is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to the priority of the available language. (Function depend the recording of DVD).
3. If Parental is selected, use the **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set the rating level as follows:
  - Press the **►** button to enter, the rating level list will appear.
  - Press the **▲** or **▼** button to select the desired level.
  - Press the **ENTER** button to enter, password enter window will pop up.
  - Enter the six digit password (default password is **136900**) by pressing the **Numeric** buttons.
  - Press the **ENTER** button to save the settings and exit.

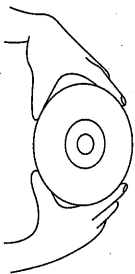

4. If Password is selected, press **ENTER** button to enter, the subsetting menu will appear.
  - If Password Mode is selected, use **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to set it ON (activate the rating level setting) or OFF (Password is needed).

5. If Default is selected, use **Direction** and **ENTER** buttons to reset all settings to default settings or press the **SETUP** Button to exit without changes.

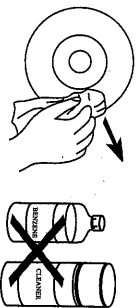
## Care and Maintenance

### CARING FOR DISCS

Treat the disc carefully. Handle the disc only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.



- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the disc label.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth. Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean the disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section of the disc, it is probably dirty or damaged (scratched).
- When cleaning the disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the disc to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



- Discs should be stored in their cases after each use to avoid damage.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high temperatures or dust, etc. Prolonged exposure or extreme temperatures can warp the disc.
- Do not stick or write anything on either side of the disc. Sharp writing instruments, or the ink, may damage the surface.

### CLEANING THE UNIT

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning.
- The finish on your unit may be cleaned with a dust cloth and cared for as other furniture. Use caution when cleaning and wiping the plastic parts.
- Mild soap and a damp cloth may be used on the front panel.
